women during the pandemic are Cyber Stalking, Sex Extortion, Cyber Hacking, Cyber Bullying, Sexual Abuse (including sexually explicit and pornographic content against the victim), Cybersex Trafficking, and Phishing. She also gave precautionary and counter measures for those offences and how to handle those crimes along with examples. Then he proceeded to talk about vulnerabilities in mobile applications which can be exploited in multiple ways by using malwares such as bots, Trojans, key loggers, worms, viruses, spywares, root kits and ransom ware. He has explained walked us through a case study on online narcotics marketplace called Silk Road which was set up in 2011 by Ross Ulbricht which had 957,079 registered users but was taken down in September 2013.







CYBER FORENSICS INVESTIGATION AND ANALYSIS (25-10-2021)



CYBER FORENSIC INVESTIGATION AND ANALYSIS (25.10.2021)



CRIME ANALYSIS AND CRIME MAPPING (23.09.2021)

Crime analysis includes tactical and strategic analysis and administration analysis. Crime analysis examines recent criminal events and potential criminal activity by analysis hoe, when and where the events to establish. Tactical analysis focuses on specific information about each crime such as method of entry, point of entry, suspect's actions, victim's characteristics, type of weapon used and date, time and location of the crime. Usually victims examined under tactical crime analysis are there in which the victim and offender are unknown to one another. Crime

mapping is used in tactical analysis to reveal analysis of criminal activity and to the identity clusters of criminal activity and to identity - optional relationship between crime and various geographic variables.
